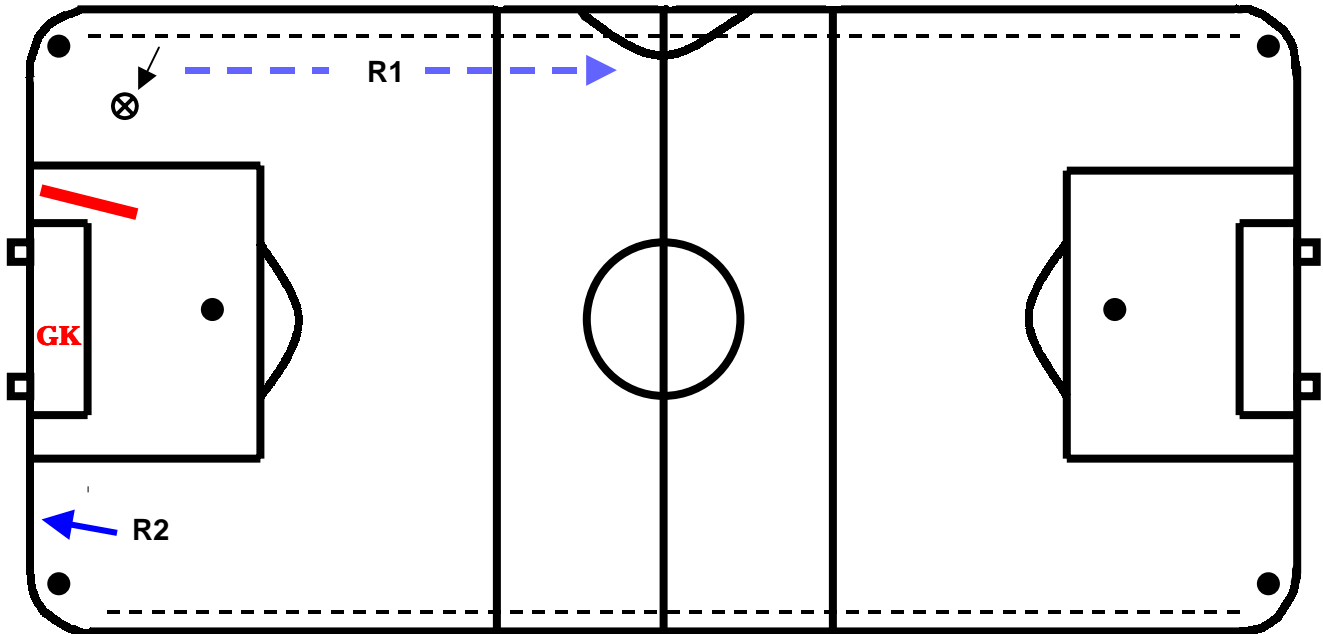

In this illustration, we have a restart just outside the **RED** defensive penalty area. R2 has taken the deep position to judge the restart and help with wall placement if necessary. R1 is at the ball, but will move to the trail position after he/she is sure the requirements of the free kick are met. If wall placement becomes a problem, R2 can go in to assist and move the wall from behind, while R1 stays with the ball and holds the restart. If R2 comes in to assist, R1 must hold the restart until R2 has a chance to get back and out of the way. R1 is going to have the restart whistle, but needs to make sure R2 is ready. R1 should be ready for the quick counter-attack, especially if the three-line violation is waived for this match venue.

Since a quick restart could be taken, R2 needs to get deep **in a hurry**. If there is any sense that R2 cannot get into position, R1 could stay at the lead position and R2 becomes trail. Often, due to encroachment issues, R1 will have the time to set the wall and hold the restart. However, should the attacking team see an advantage to go quickly, R1 must let them take the chance. R2 must also be prepared for this possibility. The attacking team does not get "two bites of the apple" if the quick restart fails to gain the advantage they were looking for.
